This volume continues the publication of abstracts of feet of fines relating to Wiltshire to the year 1377. It follows the Calendar of the Feet of Fines relating to . . . Wiltshire . . . 1195 to . . . 1272 edited by E. A. Fry, published by the Wiltshire Archaeological and Natural History Society in 1930 and now perhaps a little in need of revision, and Abstracts of Feet of Fines relating to Wiltshire for the Reigns of Edward I and Edward II edited by R. B. Pugh, published by the Society (or, as it was called until 1967, the Records Branch of the Wiltshire Archaeological and Natural History Society) in 1939. Mr. Elrington took up the work in 1967 while Honorary Editor of the Society and completed it after resigning that post in 1972. The Society is indebted to him not only for his labour in editing this volume but also for the time and energy he employed so fruitfully as its Honorary Editor. The Society gratefully expresses its thanks to the trustees of the Isobel Thornley Bequest for a most generous grant towards the cost of printing.

#### INTRODUCTION

Feet of Fines are a group of documents recording transactions in land. They extend over a period from the end of the 12th century to the earlier 19th with relatively little change in form, and their importance, both for conveyancing and for historical and genealogical research, has been so large that many accounts of them have been published. It is not intended therefore in the present introduction to do more than provide such explanation as will make the abstracts printed below intelligible.

#### FEET OF FINES

The foot of a fine records a final agreement made in a court of law between the parties to an action brought in that court about the tenure of land. The agreement, sometimes called a final concord by historians,2 was commonly known as a fine; that word was not used in any penal sense, nor even because of the money payment that was made for the licence to compromise the action, but because the agreement brought an end to the dispute. In the 12th and 13th centuries fines were often settlements of genuine legal disputes, but by the time of Edward III all fines followed from actions that were brought to the court not because the parties were in disagreement but because they wished to have a pre-existing agreement corroborated by the court. As a method of conveying or settling land it may seem devious and cumbersome, but it was an effective and therefore much used instrument for cutting through the complexities of the feudal land law. A fine afforded incontestable evidence of the transaction, was legally binding on the parties, protected the rights of married women, barred the claims of others within certain limits, provided a way of dealing with reversionary interests, and made it possible to direct the future succession to property.3

When a final agreement was granted by the court it was engrossed as a tripartite indenture, that is to say the record was written out three times on a single parchment, two copies being written head to head and the third at right angles to them across the foot of the parchment. The three copies were then divided from each other by cutting an indented, or wavy, line vertically between the two halves of the upper two-thirds of the parchment and another

horizontally above the lower one-third. The halves of the upper two-thirds were given, one each, to the parties to the agreement; the lower one-third—the foot of the fine—was kept with the records of the court.

#### THE DOCUMENTS

The feet of fines abstracted below are preserved in the Public Record Office in London as part of the records of the Court of Common Pleas. Series I (i.e. those up to the end of the reign of Henry VII) have the class-number C.P. 25(1). They are arranged county by county in files that are themselves grouped in 'cases'. The fines for Wiltshire for the reign of Edward III are in case 254, files 40-5, and case 255, files 46-53. In addition there are files of fines that relate to more than one county, known as divers counties fines: for them the abstracts below draw on case 286, files 35-8, case 287, files 39-45, and case 288, files 46-50. Within the arrangement county by county the fines are arranged by regnal years, but not in strict chronological order within each regnal year, and are numbered in sequence with a figure stamped on the back. Serial numbers on the front of each document, added in comparatively modern times, are evidence of at least two earlier arrangements. The documents are mounted on guards and filed between boards in varying numbers, usually about 40 to a file. Their size is often as small as 9 in.  $\times$  5 in. (229 mm.  $\times$ 127 mm.) or as large as 18 in.  $\times$  12 in. (457 mm.  $\times$  305 mm.). Each foot has a hole towards the upper left-hand corner where it was pierced for filing. The smaller documents are generally in excellent condition; the larger ones tend to be worn where they have extended beyond the rest or have been folded, and the legibility of writing that has become faint has often been further impaired by the use of gallic acid. As might be expected, the handwriting, ink, and parchment vary within fairly narrow limits. All medieval fines are written in Latin.

The feet of fines are inscribed with some words and figures that are not part of the actual record of the agreements. The serial numbers have already been mentioned; endorsements and abbreviated marks near the lower right-hand corner of some feet are discussed below. Along the indented line that forms the upper edge of each foot are parts of the letters forming the word 'cyrographum', which was written along the spaces between the parts of the indenture before it was divided. Finally, the name of the county, 'Wiltes', is written boldly and with a flourish across the bottom of the foot, as are similarly abbreviated names on divers counties fines.

For the purposes of compiling the abstracts below, all the files of feet of fines for Wiltshire and for divers counties in the reign of Edward III were examined. One document (no. 135 below) was badly defective, but a reference to a transcript of the fine made in the 15th century had been put on the file by one of the staff of the Public Record Office. One abstract (no. 71) is taken from a calendar made about the year 1700.<sup>2</sup> A few abstracts and transcripts

have been encountered in other places but have not provided any additional material.

#### FORM AND CONTENT OF FEET OF FINES

Although each fine follows a pattern there is a range of variation. An idea of the form and content in the 14th century can be given by reciting two simple but otherwise characteristic examples, analysing the constituent parts of the record, and indicating how each part might be modified to suit particular circumstances. A full translation of the document abstracted below as no. 392 is as follows, with numbers added in square brackets to identify the various parts:

This is the final agreement made [1] in the king's court at Westminster [2] on the morrow of St. Martin in the twenty-fifth year of the reign of Edward king of England, the Third from the Conquest, and the twelfth of the reign of the same king of France, [3] before John de Stonore, Roger Hillary, Richard de Kelleshull, Richard de Wylughby, John de Stouford, and Thomas de Fencotes, justices, and others of the king's faithful subjects then there present, [4] between Robert le Copener, plaintiff, and John Vyrly of Chaldrynton, deforciant, [5] concerning one messuage and two virgates of land with their appurtenances in Chaldrynton, [6] whereon a plea of covenant was summoned between them in the same court, [7] that is to say that the aforesaid Robert has acknowledged the aforesaid tenements with their appurtenances to be the right of that John, as those which the same John has by gift of the aforesaid Robert, [8] and for this acknowledgement, fine, and agreement the same John has granted the aforesaid Robert the aforesaid tenements with their appurtenances, and has rendered them to him in the same court, [9] to have and to hold to the same Robert and his heirs from the chief lords of that fee by the services which belong to the aforesaid tenements, for ever.

Similarly the translation of the document abstracted as no. 244 is:

This is the final agreement made [1] in the king's court at Westminster [2] on the morrow of St. Martin in the fourteenth year of the reign of Edward king of England, the Third from the Conquest, and the first of the reign of the same king of France, [3] before John de Stonore, William de Shareshull, John Inge, John de Shardelowe, Richard de Aldeburgh, Roger Hillary, William Basset, James de Wodestok, and Richard de Wylughby, justices, and others of the king's faithful subjects then there present, [4] between John de Molyns, plaintiff, and Roger Leger, deforciant, [5] concerning the manor of la Boxe with its appurtenances, [6] whereon a plea of covenant was summoned between them in the same court, [7] that is to say that the aforesaid Roger has acknowledged the aforesaid manor with its appurtenances to be the right of that John, [8] and has remised and quitclaimed it

from himself and his heirs to the aforesaid John and his heirs for ever. [10] And besides, the same Roger has granted for himself and his heirs that they will warrant to the aforesaid John and his heirs the aforesaid manor with its appurtenances against all men for ever. [11] And for this acknowledgement, remise, quitclaim, warranty, fine, and agreement the same John has given the aforesaid Roger one hundred marks of silver.

The form of the two examples is the same as far as [6]; the variations in form that are encountered in the fines abstracted below are mostly from [7] onwards. Very few of those fines, however, are so simple in form and content.

The several parts of the record that have been picked out with numbers in the examples are:

1. Place

5. Property

9. Habendum clause

Consideration

2. Date

6. Plea

10. Warranty

11.

3. Justices 4. Parties

7. Acknowledgement8. Form of grant

To them may be added some parts which occur relatively infrequently:

- 12. Attornment
- 13. King's order
- 14. Endorsement

The parts numbered 1-5 occur in every fine, 6 in all but one of those abstracted below; 7 and 8 occur in the great majority, and one or other is indispensable; the inclusion of 9-14 depends on the circumstances. The parts will be considered in turn, with the variations that they show in the Wiltshire fines of Edward III.

#### 1. Place

All the fines abstracted below were made in the king's court of Common Pleas sitting at Westminster or, during the Scottish Wars in the earlier part of the reign, at York.

#### 2. Date

Each fine is dated according to a 'return day'. The writ that initiated the action on which the agreement was to be based had to be returned, i.e. required the nominal appearance of the parties, in court at a specified time. A return day was expressed as a precise date, which was the beginning of the week in which the parties were to appear. Thus a fine dated on a particular day may have been made on any day in the week beginning with that day. The return days were:

four in Hilary term—the octave (20 Jan.) and quindene (27 Jan.) of St. Hilary, and the morrow (3 Feb.) and octave (9 Feb.) of the Purification; four in Easter term—the quindene (i.e. the day a fortnight after) of Easter, three weeks from Easter, one month from Easter, and the morrow of Ascension:

four in Trinity term, from five possible days—the octave (i.e. the day a week after) and quindene of Trinity, and the morrow (25 June), octave (1 July), and quindene (8 July) of the nativity of St. John the Baptist;

eight in Michaelmas term—the octave (6 Oct.) and quindene (13 Oct.) of Michaelmas, three weeks (20 Oct.) and one month (27 Oct.) from Michaelmas, the morrow (3 Nov.) of All Souls, and the morrow (12 Nov.), octave (18 Nov.), and quindene (25 Nov.) of Martinmas.

The return days in Easter term and the first two in Trinity term are related to movable feasts. The relationship between the movable and fixed return days in Trinity term varies according to the date of Easter. It would be unwise to generalize about the practice of the court on the basis of only the Wiltshire fines of Edward III, beyond mentioning that in years where the quindene or even the octave of Trinity overlaps with the morrow of St. John the Baptist the fines may be dated by either the movable or the fixed feast. It may be noticed in passing that the second return day in Hilary term is the morrow of the Purification and not, as has been stated several times in print, the feast of the Purification itself.

A considerable number of the fines abstracted below were made on one day and granted and recorded on another, a feature which occurs in earlier fines but becomes more frequent in Edward III's reign. It is said that the commonest reason for there being two stages was the necessity for the attornment of a tenant, and while that may be true it is not positively supported by the fines abstracted below. Of nos. 101-51, for example, thirty-six (a proportion higher than average) were granted and recorded on a day subsequent to that on which they were made; of those thirty-six only ten specify that there were tenants and another six relate to property that included rent; only one records the attornment of a tenant.

A change occurs in 1332 in the form of fines made on one day and granted and recorded on another, at least for the Wiltshire fines. The double-dated fines up to and including no. 102 below give the date on which the fine was made, the justices, the parties, and the subject before indicating that the fine was afterwards granted and recorded at a specified place and date, before the same or different justices, between the same parties, with perhaps some changes resulting from death, and concerning the same subject; from no. 103 onwards the place, date, and justices of the making of the fine are immediately followed by the same details for the grant and record, so that the parties and the subject are recited only once. There are exceptions at nos. 183, 201, 217, 529–30, and 636, where death among the parties made it necessary to revert to the older, more elaborate form.

#### 3. Justices

Apart from the slight change in form mentioned immediately above, nothing needs to be said about the justices.

#### 4. Parties

The parties are defined according to the nature of the plea on which the final agreement was based: when the plea was one of covenant, as in all but two of those abstracted below, the parties are called the plaintiff and the deforciant. In the two exceptions, based on pleas of warranty of charter, the parties are called plaintiff and impedient. Whereas the parties in the examples given above are each a single person, more often they are a group of people, commonly a husband and wife.

Sometimes one person or more was represented in court by another in his place, the definition of the party being followed by the form 'by A. de B. in their place (or in N.'s place) for winning or losing'. Women were so represented more often than men, plaintiffs more often than defendants. In some instances it is stated that the representative appeared by the king's writ or as guardian. When a representative appeared as guardian he is said to be for winning only, and losing is not mentioned.

The parties are usually described only by forename and surname. There may be added one of the following, possibly as a substitute for a surname: place of riogin or residence, ecclesiastical office, the title of earl or the rank of knight (but not lower peerage titles or lower ranks, perhaps a sign of the antiquity of fines), the distinctions 'the elder' and 'the younger'. Callings other than clerk and chaplain are rarely indicated, but that is to be expected because the parties are mostly landowners or their feoffees. The only title that is prefixed to a name is 'master', which is not frequent.

#### 5. Property

The property conveyed or settled by fines had to be land held freely, not in villeinage, and in perpetuity or for life, not for a term of years. The word land in this sense has a wide connotation, though the fines themselves use it specifically to mean arable land. The fines abstracted below are concerned characteristically with manors, houses (usually called 'messuages'), arable land (measured in carucates, virgates, and acres), meadow, pasture, woodland, rent, and the advowsons of churches. Other types of property, in buildings ranging from castles to byres, in land, in dues, in offices, and in franchises, are singled out in the index under 'property'. With the sole exception of advowsons, every type of property is recorded as being 'with appurtenances'.

The location of the property is indicated as a rule only by the name of the manor or township ('vill') to which it belonged, with the addition of the name of the county when the fine relates to property in more than one county. In a few instances a more precise location is given when there is a division of a particular estate. Occasionally the description of the property names a life-tenant in possession; much more often it is the terms of the grant that show the existence of a life-tenant.

#### 6. Plea

All but two of the fines abstracted below were made in the course of actions called pleas of covenant, by which the plaintiff alleged that the defendant had

failed to keep an agreement. The exceptions are nos. 45 and 102, where the pleas were of warranty of charter, by which the plaintiff called on the defendant to fulfil his undertaking to protect the plaintiff's title to the property at issue or else to give other land instead. In one fine, no. 8, the nature of the plea is not specified, but the way in which the parties are defined and the kind of property show that it was one of covenant. Covenant had gradually replaced warranty of charter as the usual plea on which to base a fine, and after the early years of Edward III it was invariably used.

#### 7. Acknowledgement

In form, all the fines may be classified as those that do and those that do not include an acknowledgement by one party of the other's right to the property at issue. The fines that do include an acknowledgement may be subdivided into two groups. In the first, as in the first example recited above, A acknowledges the property to be the right of B as that which B has by A's gift; fines of this sort were called sur cognizance de droit come ceo quil ad de son done, or come ceo in short. In the second, as in the second example, A acknowledges only that the property is the right of B; such fines may be called sur cognizance de droit tantum. The party making the acknowledgement is called the conusor, and the party whose right is acknowledged the conusee. The conusor may be either the plaintiff or the defendant, being commonly the plantiff in some types of fine and the defendant in other types; as is explained below either the conusor or the conusee, and either the plantiff or the defendant, may be the one who holds the land as the result of the fine.

When several persons are joined as plaintiffs or defendants some minor complications may occur: in fines come ceo, and occasionally in fines sur cognizance de droit tantum, the conusors and the conusees do not necessarily include all those joined as plaintiffs or as defendants; and whereas the conusors seem invariably to be the same persons as those by whose gift the right exists, the conusees do not necessarily include all those named as holding by virtue of the gift.

#### 8. Form of grant

In the abstracts printed below, fines with acknowledgements greatly outnumber those without acknowledgement. Following an acknowledgement, whether come ceo or de droit tantum, the conusor may surrender the property by remise and quitclaim to the conusee, as in the second example recited above, or the conusee may grant back the property to the conusor and may additionally render it to the conusor in court, as in the first example. All or part of the property may be granted in reversion upon the death of a lifetenant, in which case, of course, it cannot be rendered in court. Where the acknowledgement is come ceo there may be no record of a grant at all.

Where the acknowledgement is *de droit tantum* the conusor may render the property to the conusee in court or may grant him the reversion.

The fines which include no acknowledgement and must therefore record a grant or surrender were called *sur concessit*. The abstracts below represent three different forms of grant in such fines: (1) the defendant has granted the property to the plaintiff and has rendered it to him in court, (2) the defendant has granted to the plaintiff the reversion of property held by a tenant for a term, (3) the defendant has granted the property to the plaintiff and has remised and quitclaimed his interest to the plaintiff.

The various forms may perhaps be conveniently tabulated as follows, the number following each form indicating an instance among the abstracts printed below:

come ceo with remise and quitclaim to conusee (58)

with grant back to conusor (3)

with grant back and render to conusor (2)

without grant (37)

de droit tantum with remise and quitclaim to conusee (8)

with render to conusee (10) with grant to conusee (14) with grant back to conusor (35)

with grant back and render to conusor (1)

sur concessit grant with render (22)

grant of reversion (103)

grant with remise and quitclaim (270)

Some fines combine more than one form, since different parts of the property may be subject to different forms of acknowledgement or to no acknowledgement, and to different forms of grant. In the abstracts printed below, a grant back to the conusor without render occurs only in combination with other forms.

#### 9. Habendum clause

Whatever the complexities of the acknowledgement and grant, all the fines except those incorporating a remise and quitclaim contain a clause showing precisely what tenure is to result from the fine: who is to hold the property, and from whom, and by what service, and how he is to be succeeded. Where there is a remise and quitclaim it is in the form 'to A and his heirs for ever', as in the second example recited above. In most instances, however, there is a clause which may be called the habendum from its first word, the Latin for 'to have'. The habendum clause takes its simplest form in the first example recited above at [9]. The variations that might be introduced are that the descent of the property may be directed to others than the heirs of the grantee or to a special class of heirs, that tenure may be other than from the chief lords of the fee (i.e. the immediate feudal superior), and that a rent from the property may be reserved.

Even where tenure is to be in fee simple, that is to say where the property is to be held by the grantee and his heirs for ever, a fine in which a husband and wife are grantees has to say whether it is the husband's or the wife's heirs who are to inherit. A fine may state that the property is to be held by the

grantees or others after them for life, or by the grantees and their issue (the 'heirs of their bodies'), or by the grantees and their male issue; the last two tenures are called 'in tail' and 'in tail male'. A fine must state to whom the property is to 'remain' on the extinction of a life-estate (an absolute remainder, since the event is inevitable) or on the failure of issue (a contingent remainder, since the event may never happen). Many 14th-century fines had the purpose of imposing a particular succession on a property, and may therefore contain complex habendum clauses, sometimes including both life-estates and estates in tail.

The tenure is mostly specified as being from the chief lords. Sometimes it is specified as being from the king. The statute *Quia Emptores* (1290) prohibited the creation of a new intermediate tenancy in fee simple, so that where tenure is from the grantor it is necessarily in tail or for life only, with reversion to the grantor and his heirs. Rents of real value, but not the many quit-rents of a rose, are often guaranteed by a clause giving the recipient the right to distrain for non-payment.

#### 10. Warranty

The fines abstracted below show little variation in the form of the clause by which the grantor warrants the grantee. Almost all are in the same form as that of the second example recited above at [10], with any expansion that may be necessary to take account of complexities in the grant or the habendum clause.

#### 11. Consideration

Just over half of the fines abstracted below include a consideration theoretically given by the grantee to the grantor. A few of them take the form of annual rents; the great majority are single payments, expressed in round sums either of marks or of pounds or shillings, with a very limited range of variation. The smallest is 40s., the largest £1,000, and there are only 15 intervening amounts. All the amounts are multiples of 20, and in later times the consideration was usually 20 times the notional annual value of the property as stated in the writ on which the fine was based. Clearly it would be unwise to assume that the considerations represent precisely either a purchase price or an assessment of the property's value, but the size of the considerations and the apparent values of the properties keep in some sort of proportion. Equally, while it would be wrong to assume in all instances that fines which record a consideration are in the nature of sales and those which do not are in the nature of family settlements, there are indications that it was often so.

#### 12. Attornment

According to legal theory a lord's disposal of his interest in land held by a free tenant was incomplete without the tenant's assent, called his 'attornment

as tenant'.¹ At the end of some fines it is stated that persons named as tenants earlier in the fine were present in court, assented to the fine, and did fealty to the new lord. There are many more instances, however, where tenants named in a fine are not recorded as having attorned. There are no instances, moreover, in the abstracts below of attornment by a tenant who has not been named earlier in the fine, and as only life-tenants are so named there were evidently many tenants, particularly of manors and lordships, whose attornment is not recorded in the fines. It is likely that attornment is recorded only where a life-tenant might be thought to have a hereditary right, as is borne out in the high proportion of attornments by dowagers and in two instances (nos. 277, 298) where tenants are recorded not as having done fealty but as having acknowledged that their tenure was only for life and as having rendered up their tenements in court.

#### 13. King's order

Where a fine relates to property that was held directly from the king there is a statement at the end that the fine was made by the king's order; if only part of the property was so held it is stated that the order relates expressly to that part.

#### 14. Endorsement

Until 1360 a fine barred claims to the property by people who were not party to the fine and did not enter their claim within a year and a day; 2 claims that were so made were endorsed on the feet of fines in the simple form 'A. de B. puts in his claim'. A statute of 1360 took away the ability of a fine to bar an outsider's claim, 3 and of the fines abstracted below one of 1357 (no. 455) is the latest to bear an endorsement. The effectiveness of the fine as a bar was one of its attractions, and the number of fines subsequently diminished.

#### ABBREVIATED MARKS ON THE FACE

Many of the early fines bear abbreviated marks near the lower right-hand corner, of which the significance has not yet been determined. Of the fines abstracted below about two-thirds up to the year 1335 are marked st'; the remainder in that period, in roughly equal proportions, are either unmarked or marked with a t or, in six instances, s (4 times),  $n^l$  (once), or  $mr^m$  (once). In later years the marks become rarer: by 1340 the fines are unmarked as often as not, and soon afterwards the marked fines are exceptional. The commonest mark continues to be st', with t occasionally, md twice or thrice,  $n^l$  twice more, and s once more. The last three clearly marked fines are nos. 297 (1344), 362 (1348), and 386 (1351), all with st', but it is not possible to be definite because the marks are not always very firmly made and the part of each document

that they occupy is the one most likely to be folded and worn. An attempt to correlate the marks with the contents of the documents on which they occur produced no conclusion. The mark  $n^l$ , which in two out of three instances is on fines made by the king's order, is for the word *nihil* and suggests that the marks are concerned with payment;  $mr^m$  and  $m^d$  are evidently abbreviated forms of memorandum.

#### EDITORIAL METHOD

The abstracts were begun on the assumption that they would take exactly the same form as those for the reigns of Edward I and Edward II. The desirability, however, of numbering all the abstracts in a single sequence prompted the editor to depart from the order which the documents take in their files and cases and to rearrange the fines in strict chronological order. The divers counties fines take their chronological places, and the double-dated fines are arranged according to the dates on which they were granted and recorded, the dates on which they were made being added in brackets. The method of indicating the forms of acknowledgement and grant that was employed for the fines of Edward I and Edward II has not been used, because many of the fines of Edward III combine two or more forms and are concerned with reversions.

The following editorial conventions have been used. (1) The parties of plaintiff and defendant are, after their first occurrence in each abstract, referred to as 'pl.' and 'def.', and those abbreviations are used indiscriminately for singular and plural. (2) A few other standard abbreviations, especially of frequently recurring dates and of sums of money, are systematically used. (3) Place-names, or parts of place-names, that are translated from Latin are set in italic type, except the county names in divers counties fines which are given in standard forms. (4) Other place-names and all surnames are rendered in their original spelling; the regular contractions are extended, and the mark of suspension with which many names end in the MS, is omitted unless a name is obviously curtailed. (5) A forename set in italic indicates a person, being one of several in a party, whose heirs or inheritance are specified in the fine, usually in the habendum or warranty clause, when for the sake of brevity the abstract does not otherwise include the fact. (6) Latin forenames are mostly given in an English or French form but a few remain in Latin form, e.g. Ebulo, Emma, Eudo, Eufemia, Geva, Gunnilda, Ida, Laurencia, Resus, Reynbrunus, Willelma. (7) Place-names and personal descriptions when appended to forenames standing otherwise alone are treated as surnames, but when appended to names already comprising forename and surname they are treated as descriptive even though they may in fact have been additional surnames; descriptions in English or French are given in the original spelling, in inverted commas. (8) Cardinal numbers other than those coming immediately after the names of the parties are given in figures rather than words, a

practice which is extended to fractions of units of measurement. (9) For sums of money the qualifications 'sterling' and 'of silver' (used of marks) are omitted. (10) The number at the end of each abstract is the reference for the fine; the full reference for each begins with the class-number C.P. 25(1).

The method of abstracting may additionally be explained by considering each of the parts of a fine in the order in which they are discussed above. The place is usually Westminster; the abstracts specify the place only when the king's court was at York or when a fine granted and recorded at York was made at Westminster. The date is given in an abbreviated form: the return day of each fine is indicated but the regnal year is omitted in the abstracts themselves and is given only before the first fine of each regnal year; the year of grace is also given before the first fine within it, and at the top of each page. The names of justices are omitted altogether. The names of the parties are given as in the documents (see the preceding paragraph, 5-7); after a representative's name 'for winning or losing' is omitted. In the description of the property the abstracts invariably omit 'with appurtenances'. The clause giving the plea is omitted altogether, except in the three instances mentioned above. The abstracts give the acknowledgement in a shortened form. The form of grant is similarly shortened, and particularly where reversions are granted the abstracts are much briefer than the original documents; there and elsewhere it is to be assumed that where no limitation is expressed, such as tenure for life or in tail, the grant is in fee simple, i.e. that after the name of the grantee come the words 'and his heirs for ever'. (Where the heirs of one out of several persons are specified, the fact is indicated by that person's name being in italic, as mentioned above.) The abstract of a habendum clause assumes that unless otherwise stated the fine specifies that tenure is from the chief lords of the fee, and by the services which belong to the property, and for ever; also that where a grantee is to hold from the grantor he is charged with doing the services due from the tenements to the chief lords. The abstracts retain the distinction between 'during the life of . . . ' (tota vita predicti...), used of grantees, and 'for term of life' (ad terminum vite), used of life-tenants mentioned incidentally. Rents to be paid at more than one date in the year are stated in the fines, but not in the abstracts, to be payable in equal instalments. Remainders are specified as successive when more than one person or married couple is actually named; whether or not they are contingent will be clear from the nature of the preceding title. A clause of warranty is indicated by that one word unless it has unusual features. The amount of a consideration is indicated in standard form after the abbreviation 'Cons.'; in ordinary circumstances all the persons of one party are recorded as giving it to all the persons of the other, so the abstracts do not specify the donors and donees. An attornment is briefly indicated by the phrase 'N. has done fealty'. Abstracts of fines made by the king's order include those words. An endorsement is rendered in full translation. The abbreviated marks are not noticed in the abstracts.
